

Secondary Remote Learning Statement

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What parents can expect immediately after their child is sent home

If your child is studying at home, they will be able to immediately access our remote learning resources. Your child will need to follow their normal timetable. Our teaching teams will set tasks and review work via Google Classroom.

What pupils will learn at home, and how this compares to what they'd learn in school

Children will follow their usual timetable. Their usual curriculum/lessons will be delivered.

How long the work set will take pupils

The work we set, will take the same amount of time as a child's normal timetable.

How pupils can access remote education and devices

Each day we would like your child to:

- Log in to Google Classroom using their school Google account and continue with lessons prepared for the term that are given in their timetable
- Make sure they are also logged into Statistics24 to log their attendance
- Attend all lessons, complete all videos and assessment tasks for that day
- Check school email for updates, announcements and changes made to their Google Classroom
- Email their Head of Year for technical support or to report when there has been circumstances where following their timetable has not been possible

Expectations for parents in terms of engagement

We ask parents to ensure there is a suitable working environment and to check their child is fully focused on their schoolwork. The work is independent, so we don't need parental input beyond that.

How feedback will be provided

We will provide feedback via email and Google Classroom.

Additional support for pupils with SEND and self-isolating pupils

Students with SEND may be classed as vulnerable and able to attend school. Those working remotely may receive support from a teaching assistant if they would normally receive this in school. Teachers continue to set appropriate tasks for their classes given the needs of the students. Schools will work closely with parents of SEND pupils to make sure they have what they need to learn.
